RIVERCONNECT - WEEDING ACTIVITY with School Groups



This document has been provided to assist staff members to prepare for the facilitation of a weeding activity. This information has been provided as a guide only.

ACTIVITY 1: Studying the weeds

On site:

- 1. Look up and study the priority weeds in the 'Weeds of the Goulburn Broken field guide'
- 2. GPS Plot weeds you find in the table on page 4
- 3. Collect one weed species to 'show and tell' to the whole group at the end of the session

At School:

- 1. Read up on the Victorian noxious weed categories on Agriculture Victoria website.
 - A. Of the four noxious weed categories, which category has the most potential to cause harm?
 - B. Who is responsible for controlling Regionally Controlled Weeds?

- 2. The **Weeds of National Significance (WoNS)** inaugural list was announced jointly by Commonwealth Ministers in 1999. Twelve additional species were added to the WoNS list in April 2012.
 - A. How many weeds are on the WoNS list?
 - B. Which committee reviews the weeds on the WoNS list?

ACTIVITY 2: Weed Control

1. Locate and remove the weeds from the river site you are working at.

Equipment:

- Gloves
- Shovel
- Trowel
- Bucket
- Reusable Rubbish bag
- 'Weeds of the Goulburn Broken- a field guide to terrestrial and aquatic weeds' (Goulburn Broken CMA, 2008)

Optional:

- GPS for weed mapping
- Cage 6 x 4 trailer for collecting weeds

PRE EVENT: Permission from the land owner/ manager - Parks Vic or Greater Shepparton City Council, prior to the event. They may have recommendations on target weeds in the area.

On the day:

Discuss with students:

- Health and Safety
 - Watch out for hazards e.g. needles, holes, branches
 - No weeding down by the edge of the river bank
 - o Sturdy shoes, gloves.
- Instructions:

Students work in groups of 2 - 3. Tools (such as trowel, clippers or shovel); rubbish bag, bucket or tarpaulin for holding weeds; and a 'Weeds of the Goulburn Broken' field guide.

- Discuss key species to target see list on next page
- Show some examples
- o Groups disperse, remove weeds
- o Empty full bags / tarpaulin of weeds into trailer or make a pile in a designated place

POST EVENT: Contact land owner/ manager (Parks Vic or Greater Shepparton City Council) to collect weeds from site.
